A warm welcome to Term 2 for all of our school families and a very special welcome to new families who have joined us this term. ### **Property Update**

It is very exciting to watch the new 12 classroom block take shape. The building project is currently running to programme given the impact of asbestos removal operations encountered at the start. As you can tell from the picture, the placement of first beam castings is 95% complete. The block work to retaining wall is 85% complete and the verandah foundations poured. All of this heavy lifting of concrete beams has required a large crane to be brought in, much to the delight of students and staff. Classrooms within the construction zone had to be relocated to the hall and the literacy centre for this week for health and safety reasons. These classrooms will be back in their rooms from Monday 13th May. I would like to acknowledge and commend Mr Clark, Mrs Lambert, Miss Clark and Miss Riley and all of their students for their patience and their "can do" attitudes in maintaining their regular classroom learning programme amidst the disruption resulting from the building construction.

#### REMINDERS

- 7. If you travel a distance to bring your children to our school, or pick them up, please allow for the busy roads and traffic. This should mean you are neither late, nor are they.
