Early Drop offs to School

We have noticed an increasing number of students dropped to school very early in the morning as well as being picked up very late at the end of the school day. Our classrooms open at 8.30am and close at 3.00pm. Parents are responsible for their children outside of those hours, even if they are still on the school grounds. If you need to drop your child off early and need to pick them up after 3pm please enrol them in the Before and After School care in our School Hall.

Strike Action

As you may know by now that NZEI members across New Zealand have voted overwhelmingly to strike. Therefore school will be closed on **Wednesday 29th May** due to the strike. This decision to close the school was made by the school Board taking into consideration the health and safety of students and staff. We thank you for your support in understanding the critical issues the education sector is facing. The three key issues of attraction and retention of quality teachers, teacher workloads and funding for all students who require additional learning support continue to be critical to a resolution.

Road Safety

This is yet another reminder to drive carefully and park legally on McKean Avenue. There are a number of parents who disregard these rules and put our students at risk every day. All students and adults must use the designated pedestrian crossing when crossing the road outside the school. No stopping or parking on the yellow lines! Auckland Transport and the Police will be doing regular patrols in the vicinity of the school issuing fines to those who disregard the road rules.

Measles in Auckland schools

Please vaccinate your child or young person if they have not had one measles (MMR) vaccine. It is free at your GP.

Students in a class with someone who has measles may be asked to stay home for one to two weeks, if they have had no MMR vaccinations.

Students with one or more MMR vaccinations can still attend school.

Check your child's immunisation records in their Well Child/Tamariki Ora book or ring your GP clinic.

Tell your GP or after hours clinic if you suspect measles before you arrive, so you don't infect others.

<u>Symptoms</u>: cough, runny nose, fever, sore red eyes, then a rash.
