DIGITAL CITIZENSHIP — TIPS FOR PARENTS AND WHĀNAU

The internet has impacted lives throughout the world and it is here to stay. It certainly has changed how we do things in so many ways. Children today are digital citizens, they don't know a world without internet, technology, smart devices and social media. As young people use more digital technology to support their learning, work applications and for social interaction and recreation digital citizenship and online safety is a critical dimension of learning at school and parenting at home. It's just as important for parents/whanau to teach children about online safety as it is with teaching children about safety in general. While there might be a gap between what your child knows and how much you know about technology, you don't have to be a tech expert to help. You can offer life skills, maturity and experience your child hasn't developed yet. At school we have very clear expectations and rules when using technology and digital citizenship is a key dimension of 21st Century Learning.

Digital Citizenship for students at MWPS are:

Awareness: I will think carefully about whether the information I see online is true.

Safety: I protect my personal information and not share it online.

Myself: I represent myself in a way I can be proud of.

Kindness: I use positive actions and words online.

Respectful: I respect the rules for using digital technology.
